INTRODUCTION

We, the members of the Fourth Dauphin County Investigating Grand Jury, having received evidence pertaining to a possible violation of robbery, possession of instruments of crime, and simple assault by physical menace sections of the Pennsylvania Crimes Code, occurring in Dauphin County, Pennsylvania, pursuant to Notice of Submission of Investigation <u>04-2006-04</u>, do hereby make the following findings of fact and recommendation of charges.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Grand Jury heard credible testimony that on July 2, 2006, Eric Englehart went to the Wendy's Restaurant, 615 Park Avenue, Hershey, Pennsylvania. While one Wendy's employee was attempting to transfer the day's receipts from the restaurant, Englehart approached and pointed a pellet gun at the employee. He demanded the money while pointing the pellet gun at the employee. The employee turned over the bag of receipts to Englehart, and he fled from the scene.

RECOMMENDATION OF CHARGES

Based upon the evidence we have obtained and considered, which establishes a <u>prima facie</u> case, we, the members of the Fourth Dauphin County Investigating Grand Jury, recommend that the District Attorney or his designee, institute criminal proceedings against Eric Englehart, and charge him with violating Title 18 and Section 3701(a)(1)(ii)(robbery), Section 907(a) (possession of instruments of crime), and Section 2701(a)(3)(simple assault by physical menace).
