Mr. Conor thanked the Gaming Board Committee, Jessica from C&R and his staff for the many hours they spent on this project.

Ms. Bellamy highlighted some areas of the PowerPoint presentation. The Gaming Act requires casinos to share their gaming revenues with host counties and municipalities.

Dauphin County is entitled to receive 1% in Local Share revenue from interactive gaming as a result of the 2017 amendments to the Gaming Act. Hollywood Casino also pays an annual Slot Machine License Operation Fee of \$10 million. These funds are received by East Hanover Township and Dauphin County and are distributed like Local Share Funds. By law, Local Share Grant Funds are NOT for property tax relief. Local Share grants do, however, help avoid increases in local taxes by funding municipal projects. Fire and emergency services applicants were asked to identify service area, mutual aid agreements and explain redundancy. The allocation of funds went to: transportation, public interest initiatives, human services, multiple categories, infrastructure/facilities improvement, and emergency services/health and public safety.

COMMISSIONERS' DISCUSSION & ACTIONS

Mr. Douglas made comments in memory of Izzedine Nawasra.

He shared the experience of a local resident that has been brought to his attention—a narrative involving a young individual named Izzedine, who, at the age of sixteen, arrived in Dauphin County, Pennsylvania, in 2019. Before returning to his native Palestine, Izzedine spent four months in Lower Paxton.

During 2019, I also traveled from Dauphin County to Palestine, where I devoted a considerable amount of my visit connecting with Palestinian people. This included tours of refugee camps, visits with NGOs, and even residing with Palestinian families during my stay. It was a life changing trip for me.

Izzedine's journey to the United States was driven by a specific need: to obtain a prosthetic leg through the efforts of the Palestine Children Relief Fund, after losing his leg to an Israeli sniper's bullet during a peaceful demonstration. An image that stands out during his visit to America is one of Izzedine on the steps of the Harrisburg Capitol. Upon his return to Palestine, Izzedine took up photography, working for the organization that facilitated his prosthetic fitting.

The ongoing conflict between Israel and Hamas may seem distant to many, yet its repercussions profoundly affect our community here. I have met with local Jewish leaders who continue to grieve the events of October 7th and the rising tide of antisemitism. These issues deeply affect our neighbors in Dauphin County, and it's imperative that we recognize and empathize with their suffering.

Similarly, conversations with Palestinian American leaders have highlighted the devastating impact of civilian deaths, including women and children, and the escalating issue of Palestinian persecution even here in the states. These, too, are our neighbors, and their suffering demands our attention.

In December, Izzedine and his family were residing in Gaza's Maghazi Refugee Camp. On Christmas Eve, they fell victim to an Israeli airstrike, which led to the tragic loss of Izzedine and his entire family. Still today, indiscriminate bombings continue in one of the most densely populated regions on the globe.

Izzedine's story is just one among nearly 30,000 Palestinians who have lost their lives in the conflict, not to mention the countless injured, homeless, and starving due to destroyed infrastructure.

Although it may seem outside the purview of our board of commissioners to speak on foreign policy, sharing the experiences of our constituents, particularly those affected by war and violence, is crucial. While we may not have the authority to alter the course of conflicts abroad, we can give voice to the stories of our community members. I am grateful for the trust placed in me to share this story and support the call for a ceasefire, highlighting the need for peace and understanding within our community and beyond.

Mr. Pries mentioned there were a record number of attendees at the Great American Outdoor Show and how much of an impact it makes.



- Dauphin County is entitled to receive 1% in Local Share revenue from interactive gaming as a result of the 2017 amendments to the Gaming Act









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
PROPERTY TAX RELIEF?

2023 LOCAL SHARE MUNICIPAL GRANT CYCLE

- The pandemic and 2020 casino closures required careful consideration by applicants of the amount of requested Local Share Funds
- Building on that, since 2021, the Program Guidelines have included recommended maximum grant amounts in order to maximize the reach and impact of local share funds:
 - Non-contiguous municipal applicants \$150,000
 - Non-municipal applicants \$75,000
- Applicants retained ability to apply for grants above the recommended amounts but were required to provide justification for the higher request
